SPEAKERS BIO's

David Bullock serves as the Unemployment Consultant for Primex³, providing advocacy and representation for members at the New Hampshire Department of Employment Security. David is a AmeriCorps alum who served as a literacy and academic tutor for at-risk students in Nashua and Manchester with City Year New Hampshire and PlusTime New Hampshire. David most recently worked as an Anti-Discrimination Investigator for the New Hampshire Commission for Human Rights, the state agency charged with enforcing the state civil rights law in employment, housing, and public accommodations. David graduated from Ohio University receiving a Bachelor's of Arts in English and History in 2006 and from the University of New Hampshire receiving a Master's Degree in Public Administration in 2009.

Mike Ricker, Esq., General Counsel for Primex³ provides both legal counsel and legal loss prevention services to Primex³. Mike joined Primex³ in 2007 and has been instrumental in the development of several key education and training programs conducted by Primex³, such as harassment in the workplace, ethics and bullying. His extensive legal background, including but not limited to general litigation, municipal defense, business and employment litigation, medical malpractice and family law, and keen insight into the needs of public entities from a legal perspective, are just a few reasons why he is a valuable resource to the Primex³ membership. Chris Pope has a solid background in public safety administration and emergency management, with strong emphasis on homeland security and defense. He holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Public Safety Administration, summa cum laude, from Granite State College, and a Master of Arts in National Security Studies from the US Naval Postgraduate School. Prior to assuming his present post, Director Pope served as Chief of the City of Concord, NH Fire Department, where he was responsible for 117 employees and a regional dispatch center that handled 20,000 emergency calls per year. He developed the Emergency Management Master Plan for Concord, the State's capital city. Chief Pope came through the ranks in the Concord Fire Department, having served as a Firefighter, Paramedic, Lieutenant, Acting Captain, Battalion Chief, and Division Commander. He has attended numerous programs at the National Fire Academy in Emmitsburg, MD, and has received specialized training and education in incident command, chemical agent response, executive planning, command and control of major fire operations, interpersonal dynamics, management of emergency medical services, emergency response to hazardous materials, urban fire operations, accident investigation, team-based continuous improvement, and many other subjects.

Ty Gagne, CEO of Primex³, has over 17 years of experience in local government. He has held executive positions in the municipal, non-profit, and healthcare sectors, and was a two term school board member. Ty holds a Master of Public Administration from the University of New Hampshire, and a BS from Granite State College, where he is also a member of the Adjunct Faculty.
